

## Treasurer's Report

For the first 3 Months of 2008

When St. George's Finance Committee began to look at our church's prospects for 2008, things looked pretty glum. All forecasts pointed to a large operating deficit. In addition, we were looking at \$167,600 in major repairs, of which \$114,600 would be covered by government grants, leaving \$53,000 to be covered by our fundraising efforts in 2008.

But, at the Annual Vestry Meeting held in February, members of the congregation took heart. Changes were made to the budget in ways that would maintain our expected spending on the church's operations on a break even basis. Furthermore, a special effort would be made in 2008 to raise the \$53,000 needed for our major repairs. This meant increased giving from all of us each Sunday and a series of major fundraising events throughout the year.

So, how are we doing so far? And, what have you done so far? Our parish giving for the first 3 months to the end of March was \$29,093 versus a budget of \$29,525. Not bad, and better than the \$26,300 parish giving last year for this period.

However, our fundraising efforts so far have produced only \$2,080 versus the budget of \$7,750. We have much to do. I recently attended a meeting of the church's Fundraising Committee chaired by Tony Hadley. Many events are planned for the rest of this year as groups within the church take up the challenge. It seems to me this is bringing out the best in us. It is very encouraging. We will all need to support these efforts in a major way. Let's see what the people of St. George's can do!

## Abundant Life

Jesus says in John 10:10 that HE has come that we might have life and have it more abundantly, and in verse 28 promises us, HIS sheep, eternal life. This is a great promise and is one that I desire to see fulfilled in my life. How will this happen?

The Bible is full of GOD'S ways for successful living. In the Old Testament Moses says to the people in Deuteronomy 30:19,20: "I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore choose life that both you and your descendants may live, for HE is your life and the length of your days".

In Joshua 1:8, I find his recipe. He says "this book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, that you may observe to do all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous and then you will have good success."


Proverbs is full of GOD'S ways of how I should live. I particularly like the first four chapters, and two of the verses that I pay particular attention to are Proverbs 4:20-22. I am told to give my attention to HIS words, to incline my ear to HIS sayings; to not let them depart from my eyes and to keep them in the midst of my heart, for they are life to those who find them and health to all their flesh.

These are just a few of GOD'S promises from the Old Testament, and of course the New Testament presents me with so many wondrous promises. In the Gospels JESUS says HE is the way, the truth and the life, the bread of life, the living water, the good shepherd and the resurrection and the life. I pray these promises each morning and also claim HIM as my rock, my fortress, my health and strength, my shield and my deliverer.


These many promises in the Bible are truly what I need to see operating in my life. To return to the question how this will be, the answer comes in Acts 1:8, "you shall receive power when the HOLY SPIRIT has come upon you". Yes, this is what I need – the HOLY SPIRIT empowering me to live the life GOD intends for me.

St. Paul has much to say about the role of the HOLY SPIRIT in our lives. I frequently read chapters 6 through 8 in Romans. I often meditate on Romans 8: 1,2 which says "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in CHRIST JESUS, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the SPIRIT. For the law of the SPIRIT of Life in CHRIST JESUS has made me free from the law of sin and death. Another key verse is found in Ephesians 5:18 – "Be filled with the SPIRIT". This is a daily necessity, if not a minute by minute requirement. With CHRIST all things are possible, so I pray constantly that HE may live and move and have HIS being in me. (Acts 17:28)

Abundant life, what a promise! May I indeed live to see it fulfilled in my life. AMEN.



## The Guild of St. George's Millennium Scholarship

The maximum value of each scholarship shall not exceed \$1,000 per annum. The scholarship will be granted for a one year period and may be renewable for an additional period of up to two years.
