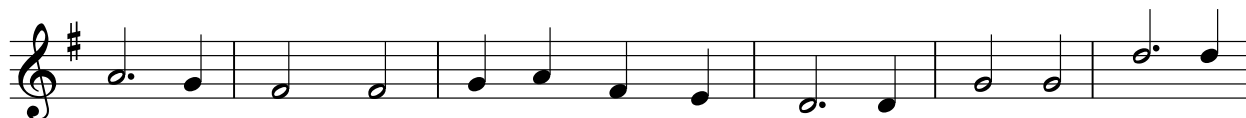





✠ Holy Baptism

The family and godparents stand. The Priest addresses the people, saying,

Priest: The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Family: We present Griffin Wolfe Pennings to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Priest: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Family: I will with God's help.

Priest: Will you by your prayers and witness help Griffin to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Family: I will with God's help.

The Priest then asks the following questions of the family.

Priest: Do you renounce all evil, all that rebels against God, all that corrupts God's creation, and all sin that turns you from God's love?

Family: I renounce them.

Priest: Do you turn to Jesus Christ as your Saviour? Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? And do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Family: I do.

The congregation stands, the Priest addresses the people, saying,

Priest: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Griffin in his life in Christ?

People: **We will.**

The Baptismal Covenant

Please stand

Priest: Dear friends, let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

People: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Priest: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Priest: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Priest: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Priest: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Priest: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Priest: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Priest: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Prayers for the Candidate

Priest: Let us now pray for Griffin, who is to receive the sacrament of new birth.

Deacon: Deliver Griffin, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Open his heart to your grace and truth.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Priest: Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Send him into the world in witness to your love.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Priest: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son, may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever.

All: **Amen.**

✠ The Celebration of Baptism

The children pour the water into the font. Then the Priest blesses the water, saying,

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: **And also with you.**

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Priest: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

People: **Amen.**

The Priest then pours water over the candidate saying,

Priest: Griffin Wolfe, I baptize you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: **Amen.**

The Priest makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead saying,

Priest: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Priest prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Priest: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant Griffin the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

All: **Amen.**

The Deacon then gives the newly baptized a candle, saying,

Deacon: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

People: **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

Priest: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People: **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal Priesthood.**

The Priest then presents the newly baptized to the congregation.

Leader: We pray to you, O Lord: Your kingdom come,

Leader: We pray for the departed and all who mourn, especially...

Prayers for those who have died are offered.

That with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal.

May they rest in peace, and rise in glory.

Priest: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your People; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to be in your presence. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night he was

handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,

**All: we remember his death; we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

Priest: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.
