- Please sit in an open pew and maintain a 2 m distance from fellow worshipers who are not in your bubble. You may speak with fellow worshippers from your seat but please do not visit others in their pews.
- Please wear your mask at all times when speaking, singing or moving around the building. It must cover your nose and mouth. You may remove your mask for a brief time, while seated, during the sermon.
- The priest will bring communion to you in your pew. Please stand if you would like to receive. Because of the restrictions, only the bread is being served, but be assured you receive the full benefits of communion
- Washrooms are available. There are spray bottles and paper towels to sanitize after use.
- Please either take your bulletin with you or place it in the recycling bin on your way out. Please do not leave them in your pew.
- At the end of the service, the greeters will invite everyone to exit by the main door. Refreshments will be served in the hall by the hospitality team. The greeters will help those who need assistance.





Please be seated

The Priest pours the water into the font and blesses it, saying,

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: **And also with you.**

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Priest: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

All: **Amen.**

The Priest then pours water over the candidates, saying,

Priest: Janissah Lindsay Grace,
I baptize you

in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Priest makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead, saying,

Priest: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Priest prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Priest: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Janissah Lindsay Grace the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

All: **Amen.**

The Giving of Light

The Deacon then gives the newly baptized each a candle, saying,

Deacon: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

All: **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

Priest: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal Priesthood.**

The Priest then presents the newly baptized to the congregation.

Priest: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world.

Priest: In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to be in your presence. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.
