INSTRUCTIONS ON WORSHIPING DURING COVID-19

We are trying to keep everyone safe while we come together for our service. We ask that you follow the guidelines that have been set out by the government and by the Diocese of Montreal.

- Please sit in an open pew and maintain a 2 m distance from fellow worshipers who are not in your bubble. You may speak with fellow worshippers from your seat but please do not visit others in their pews.
- Please wear your mask at all times when speaking, singing or moving around the building. It must cover your nose and mouth. You may remove your mask for a brief time, while seated, during the sermon.
- The priest will bring communion to you in your pew. Please stand if you would like to receive. Because of the restrictions, only the bread is being served, but be assured you receive the full benefits of communion
- Washrooms are available. There are spray bottles and paper towels to sanitize after use.
- We will not collect an offering during the service. There is an offering plate at the entrance by the Greeters where you may place an offering.
- Please either take your bulletin with you or place it in the recycling bin on your way out. Please do not leave them in your pew.
- At the end of the service, the greeters will invite everyone to exit by the main door. Refreshments will be served in the Parish Hall, people are still encouraged to take their refreshments to the lawn if the weather allows. The greeters will help those who need assistance.



The Candidates come forward and approach the Bishop.

Bishop: We now welcome with joy, those who have come forward to be baptized and confirmed and to be received into the Anglican Communion. The candidates will now be presented.

The Bishop presents the candidates, saying:

Presenters: We present Pedro Paulo Burgarelli and Gregory Abedi to receive the sacrament of baptism and to be confirmed.

The Bishop asks the candidates:

Bishop: Do you desire to be baptized and confirmed?

Pedro/ ***I do***

The bishop addresses the candidates for baptism, saying:

Bishop: In baptism, God calls us all out of darkness into this marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore, I ask: do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Pedro/ ***I renounce them.***

Gregory:

Bishop: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Pedro/ ***I renounce them.***

Gregory:

Bishop: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Pedro: **I renounce them.**

Gregory:

Bishop: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Pedro: **I do.**

Gregory:

Bishop: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Pedro: **I do.**

Gregory:

Bishop: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Pedro: **I do.**

The candidate for reception is now presented

Presenters: We present Ramy El Masri who desires to reaffirm his baptismal vows and to be received into this Communion.

Bishop: Do you desire to be received into the Anglican Communion?

Ramy: I do

Bishop: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?

Ramy: I do

Bishop: Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Ramy: I do.

Bishop: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Ramy: I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Saviour and Lord.

The bishop addresses the congregation, saying,

Bishop: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

All: We will.

Profession of Faith

Please stand

Bishop: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

All: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Bishop: Do you believe in his Son Jesus Christ?

All: **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Bishop: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

All: **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all people, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

All: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: May Christ dwell in your hearts through faith, that you may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.

All: **Amen.**

Please be seated

Bishop: Let us pray in our hearts for the church, the world, the sick and the suffering, for those who have died, and especially for Pedro, Gregory and Ramy all of whom desire the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Prayers for the Candidates

Please kneel or be seated

The Leader offers prayer for the community, then prayers for the candidates are offered, saying,

Leader: We pray for the Church throughout the world, for Mary our bishop, Debbie our Interim Priest, Holly and Susan, our associate priests, Maylanne our deacon, for this holy gathering, and for the people of God in every place.
Lord, in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: For the leaders of the nations and all in authority, especially the leaders gathered in Glasgow for the UN Climate Change Conference, and those standing for public office in the municipal elections.
Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: For the sick and the suffering,
I invite your prayers, spoken aloud or offered in the sanctity of silence.

Please offer your prayers, as the Spirit moves you

Leader: Lord, in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: For the dead and those who mourn.

Leader: Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord.

All: **And let light perpetual shine upon them.**

Leader: May they rest in peace and rise in glory.

All: **Amen.**

Leader: Let us pray for Gregory, Pedro and Ramy, who are being baptized, confirmed and received into this communion and for all those baptized everywhere.

Leader: That they may be redeemed from all evil and rescued from the way of sin and death; Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: That the Holy Spirit may open their hearts to your grace and truth; Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: That they may be kept in the faith and communion of your holy Church; Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader : That they may be sent into the world in witness to your love; Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader : That they may be brought to the fullness of your peace and glory; Lord in your mercy,

All: **Hear our prayer.**

Leader: Into your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

✠ The Celebration of Baptism

The Bishop pours the water into the font and blesses the water, saying,

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

All: **And also with you.**

Bishop: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Bishop: We give you thanks, source and sustainer of life, for the gift of water. This is the water your Spirit stirred at the dawn of creation, separating the soil from the sea, and calling forth a humanity fashioned to bear your image.

All: **Glory to you, for ever and ever.**

This is the water through which you delivered twelve tribes enslaved to the powers of empire and oppression. You made a covenant with them in the wilderness beyond the Red Sea, and led them through the Jordan into a land of promise, uniting them as one people, chosen to display your liberating power for all held in captivity.

All: **Glory to you, for ever and ever.**

This is the water sprinkled upon a people in exile, gifting them with a new heart and a new spirit, gathering them together from north and south, east and west a fulfillment of your promise to restore those who weep in despair to the joy and dignity of hope.

All: **Glory to you, for ever and ever.**

This is the water in which Jesus, Redeemer of the world, was baptized and named as your beloved child. This is the water that takes its course from the wounded side of Christ crucified, the living water that bursts tomb-sealing rock, giving rise to the new creation, and birthing from every tongue and nation a people consecrated to you. Glory to you, for ever and ever

This is the water of life that springs forth in that city where you dwell with a multitude beyond number, united in the One whom they worship to the end of time and for ever.

All: **Glory to you, for ever and ever.**

Gathered around this font, and surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, we ask you to stir the waters once again by the movement of your Holy Spirit. From these waters, raise up a people hungry for justice and peace, one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, a sign of your promise for all creation, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at the promised and eternal banquet.

We pray in communion with all the saints on earth and heaven, with the martyrs and the faithful of all ages, and in the name of the Lamb who was slain, but now reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, above all rule and authority, power and dominion, for ever and ever.

All: **Glory to you, for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Bishop then pours water over the candidate saying,

Bishop: Pedro/Gregory

I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: **Amen.**

The Bishop makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead saying,

Bishop: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Bishop prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Bishop: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Pedro and Gregory the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

All: **Amen.**

The Deacon then gives the candidates a candle, saying,

Deacon: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

All: **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

Bishop: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal Priesthood.**

The Bishop receives the candidates for confirmation, reaffirmation, and reception saying, saying,

Bishop: Let us now pray for Pedro, Gregory and Ramy who have made and renewed their commitment to Christ. Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

All: **Amen.**

After a moment of silence, the Bishop lays hand upon each candidate and anoints them, saying,

Bishop: Strengthen, O Lord your servant (Pedro/Gregory) with your Holy Spirit. Empower him for your service and sustain him all the days of his life.

All: Amen.

Bishop: Ramy we recognize you as a member of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you.

Ramy, may the Holy Spirit, who has begun a good work in you, direct and uphold you in the service of Christ and his kingdom.

All: Amen.

After the candidates have been blessed and anointed, the bishop prays over them, saying

Bishop: Almighty and everlasting God, let your hand ever be over these your servants. Let your Holy Spirit ever be with them and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your word that they may serve you in this life and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Peace

Please stand

Please stand in your pew and verbally share the peace with those around you.

Bishop The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Bishop: They are before the throne of God, and he who sits upon the throne will shelter them with his presence. (*Revelation 7.15*)

Bishop We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your People; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to be in your presence. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus

Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,

**All: we remember his death; we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

Bishop and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. 




