Priest: Holy God, source of life and goodness, all creation rightly gives you praise. 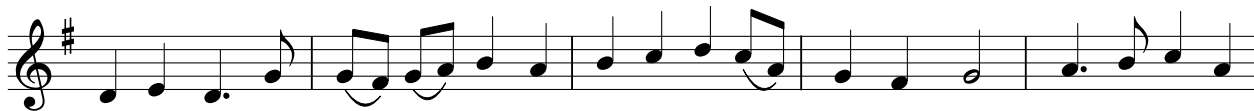
