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



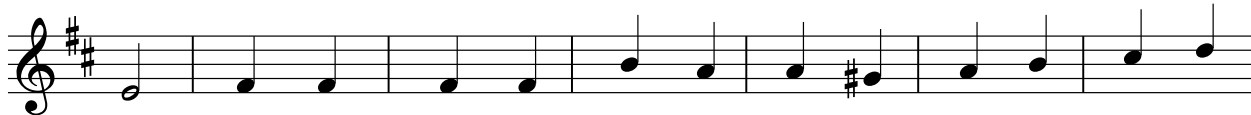

*The families and godparents stand. The Priest addresses the people, saying,*

**Priest:** The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

**Family:** We present Jed-Samuel Muthanji Karanja and Jed-Mathew Kimita Karanja to receive the sacrament of baptism.

**Family:** We present Alexina Danielle Adwoa Muah Oppong-Lefebvre to receive the sacrament of baptism.

**Priest:** Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

**Family:** I will with God's help.

**Priest:** Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

**Family:** I will with God's help.

*The Priest then asks the following questions of the family.*

**Priest:** Do you renounce all evil, all that rebels against God, all that corrupts God's creation, and all sin that turns you from God's love?

**Family:** I renounce them.

**Priest:** Do you turn to Jesus Christ as your Saviour? Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? And do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

**Family:** I do.

**Priest:** Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Jed-Samuel, Jed-Matthew, and Alexina in their life in Christ?

**People:** **We will.**

## The Baptismal Covenant

*Please stand*

*Priest:* Dear friends, let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

*People:* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Priest:* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People:* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Priest:* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People:* **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Priest:* Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Priest:* Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Priest:* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Priest:* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Priest:* Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

## ✠ The Celebration of Baptism

*Please be seated*

*The Priest pours the water into the font and blesses it, saying,*

*Priest:* The Lord be with you.

*People:* **And also with you.**

*Priest:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People:* **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*Priest:* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

*All:* **Amen.**

*The Priest then pours water over the candidates, saying,*

*The Priest makes the sign of the cross on the candidates' foreheads, saying,*

*Priest:* I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

*The Priest prays over the newly baptized, saying,*

*Priest:* Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Jed-Samuel, Jed-Matthew, and Alexina the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

*All:* **Amen.**

*Priest:* Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.  
*People:* **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

*People:* **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal Priesthood.**

*The Priest then presents the newly baptized to the congregation.*



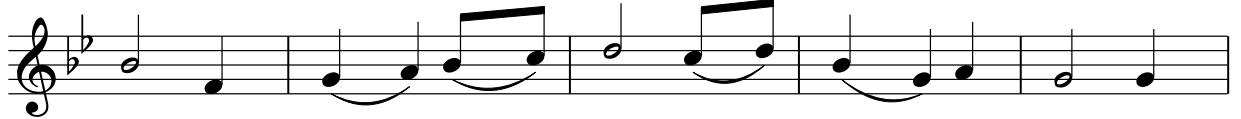

## ✠ The Celebration of the Eucharist

*Priest:* Living God, receive all we offer you this day. Grant that hearing your word and responding to your Spirit, we may share in your divine life. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ the Lord.

*All:* Amen.

*Priest:* The Lord be with you.

*People:* And al - so with you.

*Priest:* Lift up your hearts.

*People:* We lift them to the Lord.

*Priest:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People:* It is right to give our thanks and praise.

*Priest:* Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; we give you thanks and praise, because, in the mystery you disclose to us, you reveal your glory as the glory of your Son and the Holy Spirit: three persons equal in majesty, undivided in splendour, yet one Lord, one God, ever to be adored in your everlasting glory. *Please kneel or be seated*

*Priest:* We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to be in your presence. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command:

**All:** **we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;**

*Priest:* and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and forever.

**All:** **Amen.**

*Priest:* Gathering all our praises into one, let us pray as our Saviour taught us.
